The low carbon kitchen

Boilers: Around 80% of energy used in the home is for space and hot water heating. Upgrading to an Energy Saving Trust Recommended model and improving your heating controls could save you as much as £235 every year.

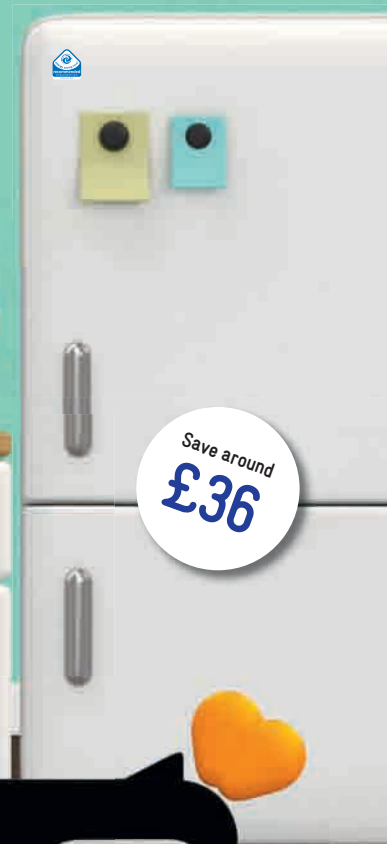
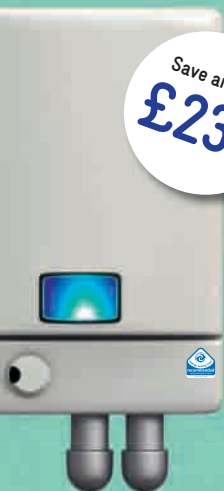
Washers and dryers: Energy Saving Trust Recommended washing machines are AAA rated for performance, spin efficiency and energy use, so you get the best possible wash for your cash.

Ovens: Replacing an old electric oven with an efficient model could save you £10 every year or £100 over its lifetime.

Kettles: Energy Saving Trust Recommended models use 20% less energy than an average kettle.

Dishwashers: An Energy Saving Trust Recommended model uses around 20% less energy per year than other models.

Fridges-freezers: The hardest working appliances, on the go 24/7. Energy Saving Trust Recommended models use 60% less energy than a typical old one, saving you around £36 a year.



Energy efficient entertainment

TV: An average home's 32" television costs more to run than a fridge-freezer', replacing a less efficient model with an Energy Saving Trust Recommended model could save you around £200 over its lifetime.

Set top boxes: If you're not planning to replace your TV for the digital changeover, make sure you invest in our recommended set top box. It uses half the power of a standard model!

Lighting: Energy Saving light bulbs use up to 80% less electricity than a standard bulb, but produce the same amount of light—saving you around £40 before they need replacing.

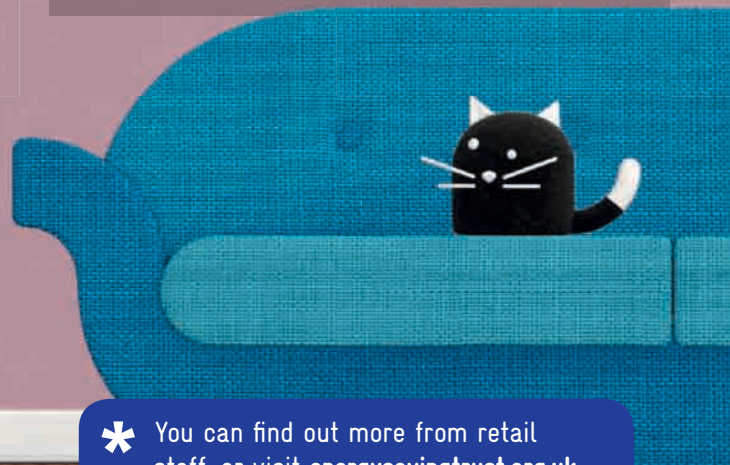

Computers: Choosing the right computer for your needs means you are not powering applications you don't need. New laptops typically use 85% less energy and cost around £15 less per year to run than new desktop computers with a monitor.

Printers: An Energy Saving Trust Recommended printer uses around 25% less power when switched on and 25% less power in sleep and standby modes.

Digital Radios: Energy Saving Trust Recommended DAB radios use around 75% less electricity annually than a standard radio.
